Summer School 2021

Q. What is the plan for Summer School 2021?

A. Summer school will take place June 21-July 16. Our current plan is to offer in-person classes 5 days each week at our summer school location (Escondido High School) for English/language arts, mathematics, extended school year (ESY) and a few other courses. In addition, students may take an online course via Edgenuity. All students will also have the opportunity to take part in on campus extracurricular and academic activities in the afternoons.

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Q. How do I sign up for summer school?

A. Make an appointment with your Counselor in order to discuss which Summer School course(s) is most appropriate for you to take. Counselors will make the recommendation to Summer School staff as to which course(s) to enroll you. You will be notified of the course in which you are enrolled in early June.

2021-22 Learning Models FAQs

Q. What courses are available if my student selects the On Campus Learning Model?

A. The On Campus Learning Model provides the most options of courses for students to take. From Advanced Placement, hands-on electives, college preparatory, and performing arts, all classes traditionally offered at the school are available to your student. All learning models provide access to all classes required to meet the A-G requirements of the California State University and University of California systems.



Q. What courses are available if my student selects the Independent Study via Edgenuity Learning Model?

A. The Independent Study via Edgenuity Learning Model provides a variety of college-preparatory, self-paced courses for students to take, and teachers serve as learning guides and support for students. Each week, the student will meet one-on-one with their teacher and will have access to additional office hours and staff to support. The self-paced courses do not include Advanced Placement, hands-on electives, or performing arts courses. However, students selecting this model may take one or two classes on campus. All learning models



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provide access to all classes required to meet the A-G requirements of the California State University and University of California systems.

Q. What courses are available if my student selects the Distance Learning via Canvas Model?

A. The Distance Learning via Canvas Learning Model provides college-preparatory courses for students, with virtual, daily live classes in which teacher and students meet. Limited electives may be conducted with a teacher, and others are available in a self-paced model using an Edgenuity course. All learning models provide access to all classes required to meet the A-G requirements of the California State University and University of California systems.

Note: If your student is in a particular Career Technical Education (CTE) or performing arts pathway, they should check with their counselor prior to selecting this model, as these classes may not be offered in Distance Learning via Canvas Learning Model.

Q. What school will my student be attending if my student selects the Independent Study via Edgenuity Learning Model?

A. All three comprehensive high schools (EHS, OGHS, SPSH) offer the Independent Study via Edgenuity Learning Model. Thus, no school transfer is necessary to select this option.

Q. What school will my student be attending if my student selects the Distance Learning via Canvas Learning Model?

A. All three comprehensive high schools offer the Distance Learning via Canvas Learning Model. Thus, no school transfer is necessary to select this option. Please note that teachers from all three schools teach Distance Learning courses, so your student may have a teacher that is from another campus for one or more of the classes. The courses will still show on the transcript as from your student's school.

Q. What if I want to change my mind about which learning model I select?

A. All families are asked to select a learning model for their student for next year at this time. The survey will be open from April 22 through 30. Later in May, the school will communicate with families, confirming the student's selection and providing a window of time to change the selection, if desired. After that window of time, changes are discouraged and will be made as space is available.



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Q. May an Independent Study via Edgenuity student be on campus?

A. Independent Study students may schedule on campus support through their teacher and may also take one or two classes on campus. If they are scheduled to be on campus at that time, they will be able to participate in any on campus activities. A variety of virtual activities may be supported by the school site and will include Independent Study students. All students are welcome to participate in after school activities on campus and should follow the appropriate protocol to sign up to participate.

Q. May a Distance Learning via Canvas student be on campus?

A. Distance Learning students are not expected to be on campus during the school day. A variety of virtual activities may be supported by the school site and will include Distance Learning students. All students are welcome to participate in after school activities on campus and should follow the appropriate protocol to sign up to participate.
